# I'M THE PROBLEM SOLVER



## I Ask...

Resistance

 **Ethnic Studies:** *How do people work together to change unfair rules or decisions?*

**Civic Skills:** How do groups achieve their goals while treating everyone fairly?

**Democratic Values and Principles:** What are the group's shared values?

**Rights and Responsibilities:** What happens when someone doesn't have the same rights as others?

**Governmental Institutions and Processes:** How do groups decide on rules and consequences?

**Public Policy:** How do people take action to influence decisions in their community?

**Tribal Nations:** Who lived here first and how do they lead and take care of their communities?

## I Ask...

Identity

 **Ethnic Studies:** *How do people's identities shape the choices they make and the resources they have access to?*

**Economic Inquiry:** How do people decide if a choice is worth the cost?

**Fundamental Economic Concepts:** What choices do people make when there aren't enough resources?

**Personal Finance:** How do people decide what to do with their money?

**Microeconomics:** How do people decide what to make, use, or sell?

**Macroeconomics:** How do government actions affect people's well-being?

**Global and International economics:** How does trade help some people and create problems for others?

**Human Systems:** How do people shape the way communities grow?

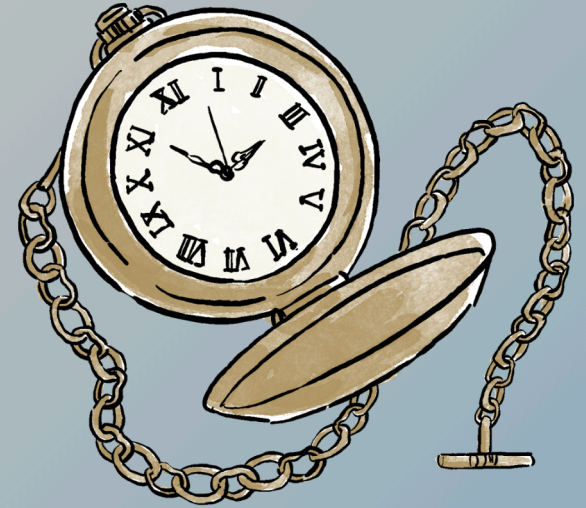
**Human-Environment Interaction:** How do people shape places and how do places shape people?

# I'M THE STORYTELLER



## I Ask...

Ways of Knowing

 **Ethnic Studies:** *Whose perspective is included, whose is missing, and why might that be?*

**Context, Change and Continuity:** What is similar or different between now and the past?

**Historical Perspectives:** How does the story change depending on who is telling it?

**Historical Sources and Evidence:** What happened and how do we know it really happened?

**Causation and Argumentation:** Why did it happen and how do we know it's true?

**Connecting Past and Present:** How can learning about the past help us understand what's happening today?
