The Minnesota Humanities Center is committed to providing a safe, clean, and healthy environment for both our employees and customers. We are committed to you and ensuring you have both a safe environment as well as a great experience when holding events at our facility. We are prepared and ready to welcome you back!

We approach our commitment to you with a shared responsibility. Both our guests and our employees are critical in preventing the spread of COVID-19. But to uphold a safe and healthy experience for everyone, we are asking for your cooperation.

- 🔄 We ask that you are COVID-19 symptom free when entering our building.
- 🔄 We ask that you not enter our building if you may have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 symptoms.
- 🔄 Acknowledge there is an inherent risk in exposure to COVID-19 in any public space where people are present. By visiting the Minnesota Humanities Center, you voluntarily assume all risk related to potential exposure to COVID-19.
- 🔄 We ask that you leverage our personal protection amenities provided: hand sanitizing stations, disinfectant wipes, and we encourage you to wash your hands regularly
- 🔄 **Masks are required in our building. They must be worn in all public, shared spaces. They can only be removed in your private meeting space if social distancing can be maintained and while consuming food or beverage.**

MHC's number one concern is keeping everyone safe. We post "Our Commitment to our Guests' Safety" on our website for our guests to review before their visit and in the front entrance of our building. MHC also provides COVID-19 related signage to remind guests of physical distancing guidelines, good health and hygiene practices, and steps to take to prevent the spread of disease.
